

A section of the wall by the club house remains covered in shrubs. Other sections are being invaded by Alexander weed.

Extensive works are being carried out at Quay House abutting the river wall.

There is undercutting at the base of the wall near the village where there is no concrete armour. There is some damage to the armour itself in places but overall the amount of growth and seaweed makes it, difficult to see the detail.

The top continues to erode, to the extent that parts are now starting to roll off at the edges. The section between the quay and the first stile is virtually unwalkable when wet and is in urgent need of attention.

Erosion around the dip by the manhole cover is particularly pronounced and the manhole cover appears to be slightly at an angle.
